Sunscreen Allowed at School

On May 4, 2017, Governor Inslee signed Substitute Senate Bill 5404, which took effect immediately. This law allows students to bring sunscreen to school and self-apply it. We welcome you to take advantage of this opportunity to protect your child's health. Please see the important directions below before sending sunscreen with your child.

- 1. Parents will provide a written note identifying the brand, and how often you want your child to apply the sunscreen.
- 2. Write your student's name on the sunscreen container with a permanent marker.
- 3. Students will apply the sunscreen to themselves. Staff will not be able to help.
- 4. Send only rub-on sunscreen to school.
 - a. Spray sunscreens can be accidentally sprayed in the eyes, mouths and noses of other students.
 - b. Spray sunscreens are particularly risky for our students and staff with asthma and other respiratory conditions.

Did You Know?

Chronic absences may lead to significant learning gaps for your child. Take an assessment of how many days your child missed this year. Three times late to school or leaving early is equal to an absence.

Here's How You Can Help

If your child is in the red zone, there is a good chance your child has fallen behind academically. Contact your child's teacher to see if there are any summer activities that would help your child make up some of this learning. Develop a plan with the school to help your child attend regularly next year.

If your child is in the yellow zone, he/she may have had their learning impacted. Pay special attention next year to make sure your child is keeping up with the work.

If your child is in the green zone, great job! Celebrate having good attendance. Make a goal with your child to have even better attendance next school year.
